PROFESSIONAL & STAFF SERVICES

<p>Basic professional fees: (requires Basic Facility Charge) Professional consultation with licensed Funeral Director including, but not limited to, expert advice on options to meet your needs, including essential services relating to disposition, drafting notices, planning scheduling of services, advising regarding possible government benefits. This charge applies whenever we provide services to you. Co-ordination of all activities, rites and ceremonies, before, during and after they have been provided, including services and supplies provided by us, as well as those provided by third party suppliers, such as flowers and death notices.</p>	\$725
<p>Documentation – permits, forms, etc.: Completion and filing of all documents necessary to carry out the services and supplies requested, including, but not limited to, death registration, burial permit, coroner’s certificate for cremation, documentation necessary to ship the body out of the country. As part of this service, we will provide you with 12 proof of death certificates; such certificates are usually accepted for most estate settlement purposes, but sometimes a provincial Death Certificate will be necessary and is available from the Office of the Registrar General. Also includes obituary posted on Van Heck Funeral Home website for online condolences and memorial donations.</p>	\$ 350
<p>Basic preparation of remains: (requires facilities for preparation/embalming/shelter) The preparation of the body for placement into the casket, may include bathing, dressing and the setting of facial features for identification or viewing without embalming.</p>	\$150
<p>Embalming Remains: (requires basic preparation of remains) Embalming is the process of replacing blood and bodily fluids with chemical preservatives. It is a process of sanitation, restoration and temporary preservation. Embalming is not required legally, but may be recommended to preserve the body between the time of death and the visitation or disposition of the deceased. Our licensed funeral directors will make a recommendation based on the condition of the body and the expected service needs.</p>	\$ 475
<p>Staff services for visitation: Staff to coordinate and oversee the visitation (informal gathering) at our premises for a period up to 4 hours. If the visitation takes place at an offsite location, this fee covers equipment charge and additional staff services. Includes but is not limited to greeting and directing visitors, supervision of parking and processing donations. Additional \$150 per hour.</p>	\$ 525
<p>Staff services for ceremony: At least one licensed funeral director and assistants to coordinate and oversee the ceremony in our chapel or other location for up to 3 hours. Includes setting up the room/area (floral arrangements, pictures, memorabilia, casket/urn, cleaning and sanitizing), greeting and directing visitors, supervision of parking. <p>Aftercare Service: This service includes canceling government issued ID, passports, etc. and the application of government death benefits. We will also assist with contacting life insurance companies, employers and any other pensions or benefits on your behalf.</p>	\$ 250

DISBURSEMENTS

Disbursements are items arranged for and possibly paid for on your behalf by the funeral home to third party providers. You are expected to pay for these items at the time the contract is entered into. Such items include but are not limited to:

Bereavement Authority of Ontario Consumer Protection Fee - this fee is charged by the Bereavement Authority of Ontario (BAO) in order to provide its services of information on your options in bereavement services and to regulate the profession making sure the law is consistently followed. (*Effective July 1, 2023 \$30*)

Coroner's fee – this is a fee charged by the coroner for issuing a certificate that allows cremation to take place. The fee is set by the Chief Coroner for Ontario. (currently \$75)

Clergy honorarium – this is an amount paid to the clergy for their services. In some cases the amount is set by the clergy, in others it is an amount to be determined by you. (\$200-\$300 is standard)

Newspaper – these are charges for death notices placed in newspapers or other media outlets. (Daily paper average is \$300.00)

Municipal death registration fee – this is a fee charged by the local municipality to register the death. The fee is set by the municipality and may vary. (As of March 23, 2022 \$20)

Floral tributes – this is the fee charged by the florist. At the time of arrangements, we will discuss the design and cost of each arrangement with you and place the order for you.

Cremated remains will be presented in a cardboard container that is suitable for interment or scattering. The price of cremation above includes this container.

Our typical turnaround time is 3 to 5 business days. Expedited cremation is available for an additional fee as described above. Once the cremation is complete the cremated remains will be returned to the appropriate agent of the crematorium.

No cremation will take place until all applicable charges are paid, or a suitable arrangement is made with the Agent of the Crematorium.

Pre-payment in advance of need:

For services and supplies that are being arranged pre-need, you may pay for the services and supplies at today’s price and we will place your money in a trust account, where it will accrue interest until the prepaid contract is fulfilled (when the services and supplies are delivered). Pre-payment can be made by Electronic Funds Transfer or Bank Draft. Funds are held in the purchaser’s name.

Guarantee:

When paid in full in accordance with the payment terms set out in the prepaid contract, the prepaid contract is guaranteed. The total payment(s) made plus interest / growth earned will be applied to the future price of the services and supplies. If the total payment(s) plus interest / growth earned are insufficient to cover the total future price of the prepaid services and supplies, we will absorb the difference as a loss. Any funds in excess of the total future price of the prepaid services and supplies will be returned or applied toward additional services, supplies and disbursements purchased at the time of need, as applicable. 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These by-laws are the rules and regulations that govern SOUTHWEST CREMATORIUMS LTD. (the "Crematorium") and have been approved by the Board of Directors of the Crematorium. These by-laws are in compliance with the provisions of the *Funeral Burial and Cremation Services Act, 2002*, and of the regulations thereto (collectively, the "Act").

1. Until changed by its Board of Directors, Administrative Office hours of the Crematorium shall be as follows:
Monday to Friday – 9 AM to 5 PM excluding holidays.
2. Identification of the deceased person shall be made by a licensed funeral establishment or transfer service prior to the delivery of the deceased person to the Crematorium.
3. Before cremation can take place, the following documents must be completed, delivered to the Crematorium office, signed by the proper authority, and approved by the Crematorium:
 - a. A cremation contract;
 - b. a coroner's certificate; and
 - c. a burial permit.
4. No cremation will take place until all applicable charges are paid or a suitable arrangement is made with the agent of the Crematorium.
5. A deceased person shall only be received for cremation in a fully combustible casket or container deemed appropriate by the Crematorium, and with a top, four sides and a solid bottom allowing the casket or container encasing the human remains to be moved using a set of rollers.
6. Once received by Crematorium personnel, the casket or container will remain closed unless permission is given by the purchaser, or by order of a judge of a court of competent jurisdiction, allowing or requiring the licensed funeral director to open the casket or container. Under no other circumstances will Crematorium staff be allowed to open the casket or container. The deceased person will only be cremated in the delivered casket or container. All non-combustible parts on the outside of the casket or container will be removed prior to cremation, if possible.
7. The Crematorium will not cremate a casket or container constructed of non-flammable or hazardous material or a material prescribed by the regulations under the Act, nor will the Crematorium cremate a body in which a pacemaker or other prescribed device is present. The foregoing does not limit the right of the Crematorium to refuse to cremate, in any instance, and without assigning reasons.
8. The Crematorium will not, under any circumstances, cremate an individual with a radioactive implant, or an individual who has received microscopic radioactive treatment such as Thera-seed within the last two(2) years. An implanted heart pacemaker or other implanted radioactive devices could explode during the cremation process and must be removed by the funeral establishment or transfer service operator, or others authorized to do so, before the deceased person is delivered to the Crematorium for cremation. The purchaser of the cremation services will be liable for any damages to the Crematorium or Crematorium staff for failure to notify the funeral establishment or transfer service, or any others responsible for the removal of such a device.
9. Proper working notice is required to be given to the Crematorium if relatives and friends wish to be present to witness the cremation process. A limited number of observers may be allowed in the Crematorium before or during a cremation. Witnessing must be confirmed and approved by the Crematorium of use, and restrictions on the number of attendees is based on that facility's safe capacity limits. Access can be denied by the Crematorium staff.
10. Stainless steel Identification tags must be placed with the human remains throughout all the stages of the cremation process.
11. Without the written and signed consent of the purchaser of the cremation services, the Crematorium is prohibited from:
 - a. cremating the remains of more than one person at once;
 - b. co-mingling cremated remains.
12. Unless a container is provided by the funeral establishment or transfer service, the cremated remains will be placed in a temporary cremation container which will be furnished by the Crematorium without additional charge. The cremated remains will be provided to the funeral establishment or transfer service following cremation unless the Crematorium receives written instructions satisfactory to the Crematorium respecting the disposition of the cremated remains by the Crematorium.

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
